Bountiful High School Sophomore Traditional & Honors English Guide for Students and Parents

Class of 2023, welcome to Bountiful High! We are thrilled to have you join our tribe and we're confident you will find BHS a great place to "B." At Bountiful High, we want every student to achieve his/her personal best; this is most likely to happen when a student is placed into classes appropriate to the his/her needs, abilities, and interests.

We offer two levels of English classes in tenth grade:

- Traditional English This class provides a rigorous curriculum that meets the needs of the majority of students.
- **Honors English** This class is designed for students who excel in English and require a faster-paced, more indepth, and challenging course of study.

Both traditional and honors classes have the following attributes:

- Follow a rigorous curriculum, including assigned homework.
- Require students to work toward mastery of the Davis DESK Standards.
- Develop critical thinking skills.
- Require students to write argumentative essays, narratives, responses to literature, and summaries.
- Provide opportunities for students to improve listening and speaking skills through Socratic Seminar and presentation delivery.
- Read a variety of novels from the DSD approved book list.
- Use the same textbook.
- Utilize technology to help improve reading and writing skills.

Honors classes differ from traditional classes in the following ways:

- Depth and complexity of study is deeper.
- Student work is more frequently independent of teacher assistance.
- Pacing is quicker.
- Early reading ("summer" reading) is required: <u>The Alchemist</u> by Paulo Coelho must be read before September 7th.
- Additional reading is required (<u>five</u> novels in Traditional English; <u>seven</u> novels, plus an additional summer novel, in Honors English to be completed before Sept. 7th).
- Course reading is done as homework rather than during class.
- Writing is more sophisticated (stronger vocabulary, more complex and varied sentence structure, greater depth of thought and analysis) and more extensively researched.
- Grammar techniques are more sophisticated and complex.

When students <u>enter</u> tenth grade Honors English, they are expected to be able to demonstrate most (though perhaps not all) of the following skills:

- Synthesize multiple texts in a multi-paragraph, thesis-based essay.
- Identify and state the function of the eight parts of speech in sentences.
- Identify and state the function of a subject and predicate in a sentence.
- Describe the impact literary devices have in a work of literature.
- Make connections between a written passage and historical events, current events, and personal experiences.
- Discover common and recurring themes across texts.
- Recognize the elements that contribute to an author's style.

If Sophomore Honors English is for you, we expect you to finish reading <u>The Alchemist</u> by Paulo Coelho before September 7th. If you need to check out a copy of the book from Bountiful High School, you may do so in our main office during the summer.

We can't wait for you to "B" a Brave.
